Please study your timetable carefully and ensure that you know the time, date and venue of each examination you are sitting.

Line up on the yard (during dry weather) at the specified time. During wet weather, please line up in the gym. (For the Art exams, please line up outside A1). **DO NOT assume that every morning exam will start at the same time.** Sometimes you will be required to line up **after** registration; other times you will be required to line up **before or during registration** - it is **VITAL** that you check the start time, and **arrive promptly**). **If you usually sit your exams in the library, go straight to the library at the specified time.**

For most of the mock exams, you will be sat in your teaching groups. Therefore, unless told otherwise, **please line up in your teaching groups, in alphabetical order.**

When entering an examination room, you must enter in **SILENCE**.

There must be **NO communication between candidates**. **Do not attempt to communicate with, or distract, other candidates.** If you require assistance, (extra paper etc.), raise your hand to attract the attention of an invigilator. (Candidates who persist in disturbing others or who communicate with others will be removed from the hall and forfeit their grade).

No bags, food, or coats are allowed at your examination desk (they are to be left in the store room at the back of the hall). A bottle of drinking water **is** permitted at your desk. **Any labels on drinks bottles must be removed prior to entering the examination room.**

Please arrive suitably prepared: A BLACK pen (plus a spare), pencil, eraser, ruler, Mathematical equipment and a calculator, where necessary. Equipment must be carried loosely or stored in a see-through pencil case or clear plastic bag.

Calculator lids MUST BE REMOVED - They **MUST NOT** be taken to your examination desk.

Smart-watches/fitbits must be removed and NOT taken to your exam desk. Regular watches must be removed and placed on the desk in front of you so that they can be clearly seen by an invigilator.

DO NOT write on examination desks. This is regarded as vandalism and you will be asked to pay for, or repair, any damage. Desks will be checked by invigilators at the end of every exam, before you leave the room. A note of where every student sits is made during each exam by the invigilators for any graffiti that is noticed **after** you have left the room.

Possession of unauthorised items, (including mobile phones, iPods, MP3 players, smart-watches, fitbits, revision notes, etc) is an infringement of the regulations and could result in **DISQUALIFICATION** from the examination. Any such items should be left in your bag - or, better still, at home!

When NOT sitting an examination, you must attend your normal timetabled lessons.

If you miss a mock exam, for any reason, **you will be expected to sit it at another time.** "Catch up" sessions will be scheduled and you should speak to either Mrs Graham or Mrs Cummings (the Exams Officers) to arrange a time to sit any missed exams. Alternatively, you can sit the exam whilst another exam (that you wouldn't normally sit) is taking place.

Remember! If you are absent for the real examinations in the summer, due to illness or accident, the Examination Board will look at how well you did during your Mock Exams and take this into consideration when giving you a final grade – therefore it is essential that you do your best!
